

Dawn Donnelly Snow Drifted Pathways

Canvas work

Level - Adventurous Beginner - Intermediate

Sept. 27 - 28, 2024 (Fri-Sat) 8:30 am - 4:00 pm



This canvas project is inspired by the snowdrifts in Michigan. *Snow Drifted Pathways* takes the student into a winter wonderland. The focal point is a snowy path using the butterfly chain stitch over handmade paper (which is provided in the kit along with a brief introduction on how to make paper).

Each student's pathway will be unique with textures created using the following stitches:

- Rhodes stitches
- Fake bullions
- Buttonhole rings
- Cross stitches
- Ribbed spider
- Herringbone
- Couching
- Butterfly chain stitch
- Palace pattern
 - Fan vaulting
- Attaching paper objects

Special techniques include design and layout of your storm, the embroidery stitches above, and attaching paper objects to your canvas.

Kit includes: 14 count mono canvas which is 14" x 12", DMC Floss, DMC Pearl Cotton #5, DMC Pearl Cotton #8, Finca Pearl Cotton #3, Silk N Ivory, Impressions, Vineyard Silk, Handmade Paper, Needles.

The student should bring the following: Usual stitching supplies, stretcher bars 14" x 12" and tacks – (no scroll frame), paper scissors, magnifier and light if needed.

Design size is 10" x 8" on 14 Count Mono Canvas.

The kit comes complete with ro attached to frame, silk and metallic threads, sticking paste for finishing, a Japanese Rozashi needle, #24 tapestry needle, and instruction booklet.

Symphony by Barbara Kershaw

Pulled thread, Intermediate

Sewing pouch, $7\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ ", plus scissors case, fob, and needlebook

Symphony, pulled thread embroidery, worked on 32- or 28-count even weave, employs basic stitches such as buttonhole, stem, satin, chain, and trellis pattern with some beads.

Add small accessories to your sewing kit, or store them in the pouch with or without cord or chain for beautiful portability.

Your 2025 GLR GCC Choices


