

#### Join us for Tambour Embroidery

The modern SIG (special interest group) meets on the third Tuesday at the Festival Foods on University Ave from 9 am - Noon. This year we are going to learn Tambour Embroidery starting in January. The tools and supplies you will need are:

- Tambour embroidery hook
- Sequins and Beads
- Cotton thread (DMC stranded floss works)
- Organza fabric
- Hoop
- Embroidery stand (optional but helpful)



Our first meeting on Tambour Embroidery will be Tuesday, January 21, 2025 from 9 am - Noon at Festival Foods on University Ave. We are in the conference room above the deli area. There is an elevator or you can take the stairs. There is a sign that says the eating area is no longer open, but continue on up to the 2nd floor as that is where the conference room is located.

We will provide a design or you can create your own. We'll start with a few simple shapes to get the rhythm of using the tambour hook and learn from there.

We have placed an order for the tambour hook and organza fabric (the deadline was Dec. 31 to order as a group), so you will need to get these items if you didn't order with the group. Please see the email from December 13 with the ordering links.

I've been wanting to learn more about ribbon embroidery, and canvas work has become my favorite so it was the perfect match. Some of the more unusual threads in this piece are 7mm silk ribbon,



Rainbow Gallery Entice, and Silk Road Fiber Straw Silk. Each thread required special care and technique, so I've included a photo for you to examine.

The endowment fund is there for all of us, it's very easy to apply, although some planning is required as there are only two times a year that funds are available. You also are required to share your experience with the guild, either by teaching what you learned, giving a presentation, or doing as I am and writing something for the newsletter. I chose to share with you the experience of taking a class rather than what I learned in that class. ## January & February "Hybrid" Meetings

With the winter weather upon us, we always wonder how the weather will cooperate on the nights of our regular winter meetings. The current policy for our guild is, if the Green Bay schools are closed due to weather on our meeting day, we will not meet in person, but we will meet on Zoom. A link is sent out to all the members and it is also posted in the members-only section of the guild's website. Last year, we zoomed intentionally in both January and February.

This year we will try something a little different, we are going to test "hybrid" meetings for January and February. With the cooperation and largess of the Evergreen Quilt Guild, of which many of you are already members, we will be able to try out their "hybrid" meeting equipment for these two months.

What exactly is a "hybrid" meeting? It means we will meet in person for those who can make it, if the weather is good, but those who cannot make the meeting in person for whatever reason (distance, night driving, illness, etc.), will be able to log into a zoom meeting and still participate. You will be able to see the presentations and ask questions.

Evergreen Quilt Guild has been successfully doing this since September. They purchased the equipment and have generously allowed us to use their camera and microphone to see if this is something we want to do in the future. We can use the equipment for our January and February meetings.

Later in the spring, we will determine how things went and decide on how to move forward (yep, there will be a survey). We think this gives our members great options for our meetings. This "hybrid" format might be a great option not only in bad weather, but all year round. We have members who live at a distance, those who travel south in the winter or north in the summer, and others who find it difficult to attend due to other reasons.

If we decide that this is a good option for our guild moving forward, we will have to decide if the expenditure for the necessary equipment is worth it to our guild and allocate the needed funds. In summary and this is important...

- January and February meetings will be hybrid <u>in person and zoom</u>. You will receive a link closer to the meeting and it is also listed on the members only of the guild website.
- In the event of inclement weather, as determined by the Green Bay Area Public Schools closure, we will automatically convert to Zoom format and you will receive a Zoom link by 3 PM. The Zoom link will also be in the members only area of our GBAEGA webpage.

#### Stitches and Stems 2026

#### Stitches and Stems Raffle Quilt...

Our 2026 Stitches and Stems show is just a little over 15 months away. Wow, how time flies! This year we will make two quilts – one for the raffle and the second for the raffle or silent auction. We will make the final decision later. We are asking members to make blocks for these quilts. Tracy Reeb, Joy Zeman and Ritalyn Arps are coordinating the quilts. Any questions can be directed to them. Here are the details on how you can help.

#### Paint-Stitch-Bead Quilt

We just finished a two-month workshop on how to paint fabric with oil paint sticks and then stitch and bead them. This will be a wall hanging quilt and possibly put in the silent auction instead of the raffle. Again, it will be determined later.

Members can donate their blocks after they are stitched and beaded. We will need at least 9 blocks. If you would like to keep your block but stitch a second one for the quilt, we have extra blocks painted. Please contact Tracy for an additional painted block. Blocks should be donated by the May 22, 2025 meeting to the committee. Please put your name on a piece of paper and pin to the bottom of your block when you donate it.

#### Flower Bouquet Quilt

We found 12 free flower blocks we plan to stitch. This will be a lap size quilt. Members will receive the background fabric, the design, and a list of thread colors to use. The stitching is simple surface embroidery stitches like stem stitch, back stitch, chain stitch, blanket stitch, etc. Nothing complex, no beads or texture stitches (i.e., bullion knots or cast on stitches). The stitched blocks will be stitched together and then quilted. When the stitching is flat, the long-arm quilting can go right over the stitching and not affect anything.

We talked about these options at the November meeting and several members already signed up (Birgit, Bev F, Tracy, Lindi, Cyn, and Rita D). If you would like a block, we estimate it will take 1-3 hours to stitch. We have 6 blocks not assigned. Blocks will be distributed at the January and February meetings or you may contact Tracy to obtain a block. Blocks should be donated by the May 22, 2025 meeting to the committee. Please put your name on a piece of paper and pin to the bottom of your block when you donate it.

If you have any questions, please contact us. We are looking forward to a fun and exciting Stitches and Stems show.

# Badger 2nd Annual "Getter Done" Retreat April 3-6, 2025

**Greetings Fellow Stitchers!** 

Our retreat will start on Thursday, April 3, 2025. However, you may arrive on Wednesday evening.

Our central location:

Voyageur Inn and Conference Center 200 Viking Drive (near Hwy H and 23) Reedsburg WI 53959 608-524-6431

The easy way to get to the hotel is to Exit # 92 off the Interstate at Wis Dells. Take Hwy 12 South to Hwy 33 to the city of Reedsburg and a right turn onto Hwy H. You will be driving by Ho Chuck before turning on to Hwy 33. Reedsburg is about 17 miles from the exit. You can stay the night before for the same cost, but will need to indicate that on the registration form.

The Stitching Room will open at 8:00am Thursday morning, but your hotel room may not be ready until 3 PM. The hotel has ice, laundry, vending machines, a small shop and a nice pool/hot tub area. There is a Kwik Trip down the street, a large grocery store across the road and a McDonald's and Taco Johns a block away.

If you are unable to join us until Friday you have that option. We may also make a few daily spots available, if there are seats still available after the registration is completed. We are planning for 60 people so get the word out.

You have the choice of a private room or a room with a roommate, see registration sheet. Each hotel room has a coffee pot, small refrigerator and microwave. The hotel is handicap accessible. The cost of the rooms are \$100 per night. If you are sharing a room \$50 each or another \$100 if coming on Wednesday evening.

The cost for a single Thursday -Sunday will be \$425.00 and Friday-Sunday will be \$295.00

The cost for double will Be Thursday-Sunday \$275.00 and Friday-Sunday will be \$195.00
